In just two weeks in the month of June, during the U. S. Opens – and after a year of planning – The Village Chapel raised approximately \$45,000.00 for the following local charitable organizations: Sandhills /Moore Coalition for Human Care, Inc., Meals on Wheels, Habitat for Humanity, Boys & Girls Clubs, Sandhills Children's Center, Young Life, Family

Promise of Moore County, and the Moore Free Care Clinic. These funds were raised through the use of our Chapel resources, specifically: parking on the Chapel grounds, transportation using our bus and van, housing for student workers and missionaries in the Care Cottage and Chapel Hall, concessions offered by Hunter Hess, and donations from visitors to the Chapel during our evening events and noonday organ interludes by Stephen Gourley.

Our evening speakers included Gov. Pat McCrory, Dave Marr, Jr. of the Golf Channel, Christian author Mindy Jo Furby, Tom Stewart, owner of the Olde Sport Gallery, Beth Ann Nichols, Senior Writer for Golf Week, Les Fleisher, WEEB radio commentator, and Chris Stevens, LPGA Chaplain, along with several former U. S. Open champions and current players.

In addition to the continuous references to the Chapel chimes during the televised commentary of the Opens, the exterior and interior of Village Chapel were videotaped by NBC; and the PGA taped an interview with Pastor Jacobs concerning the history of the Chapel and its connection with the founding of Pinehurst. Perhaps most important of all – the Chapel's doors were open, providing a spiritual haven from the crowds and the heat, as a message of the Chapel's identity as the spiritual center of Pinehurst, and an expression of the love of Christ we are privileged to reflect.

All of this could not have been possible without a host of volunteers – a true team effort - organized and led by Jimmy Schneider, and enabled by the Holy Spirit inspiring, as He is faithful to do – our highest and best efforts. Let us rejoice in the blessings we've provided, and the blessings we've received!

EFM Takes Discipleship to a New Level



Beginning this September, an adult educational program—Education for Ministry (EFM) - will be offered at The Village Chapel. By expanding the possibilities of discipleship and church membership, the program enables us to fulfill our calling in Christ's Great Commission. Eric von Salzen will be the group's mentor, and Pastor John will be the co-mentor.

Every baptized person is called to ministry. The EFM program provides people from all walks of life with the education to be Christians and to carry out their ministry. All Christians need a Christian education which supports their faith and which prepares them to express their faith in day to day events. As a world-wide ecumenical program developed by the School of Theology at the University of the South, EFM affirms that the foundation for bringing Christ to the world lies in a Church empowered by an active theologically literate laity.

Thousands of people have completed this four year program, which examines the Old and New Testaments, the history of Christianity, and Christian theology. Enrollment is for one year (September—May) at a time, and you can transfer and continue the program to almost anywhere in the USA.

If you don't know whether EFM is for you, simply ask yourself this: Do I want more out of church, and do I want more out of myself as a Christian, so that I am willing to examine my beliefs and my gifts of ministry? 2 NEW BIBLE STUDIES BEGINNING IN AUGUST

The Epistle to the Galatians

Paul's Epistle to the Galatians will be the subject of a Bible Study, led by Bill Wetmore, beginning on Sunday, August 3rd, at 9:30 am in Room 101 (where we have been meeting for the past several years).

This epistle is most likely the first written document of the New Testament (about 49 AD), defining the gospel of Jesus Christ. Paul presents three major messages: 1. The defense of the gospel, 2. The truth of the gospel, 3. The application of the gospel.

Paul also explains the role of the Holy Spirit: to lead us into all truth so that we would be led by the Spirit and walk by the Spirit. Paul further explains that he has been crucified with Christ and the meaning of this for our lives (2: 19-20). Paul explains that the gospel was first announced to Abraham (3: 6-9). Further, Paul explains that "for freedom, we have been set free" (5: 1): this freedom is so that we will become a "new creation."

This great epistle is the first written account of the gospel of Christ; it is the predecessor to Paul's later Epistle to the Romans.

The Book of Revelation

The Book of Revelation will be the subject of a one hour men's Bible Study, led by Bill Wetmore, beginning on Thursday, August 7th, at 4:00 pm in the Care Cottage.

Jesus Christ revealed to the Apostle John, on the Island of Patmos, the "things which you have seen... the things which are,, the things that will take place after this."

In this Book of Revelation, we will see the truths of the seven churches, seven seals, seven trumpets, seven signs, and seven plagues or bowls, before the coming of the New Heaven and the New Earth and the New Jerusalem. We will see unfolding: the things concerning God; the things concerning Jesus Christ, the things concerning the church, the things concerning creation, and the things concerning the gospel of Christ. All this is a witness to the hand of God: past, present, and future. We will see that all things will be made new.

All men are welcomed and encouraged to join us.

MC FOUNDATION



During the US Opens the Chapel housed over 1000 nights' stay that included folks from Tennessee, Georgia, South Carolina, Michigan, Kentucky, Virginia, Indiana, Missouri, New Jersey, and Florida. Some were men that came to volunteer but most were college students arranged through MC Foundation. And what is it that they do? MC Foundation Inc. is a non-profit 501(c)3 organization based out of Atlanta, GA since 2003. Birthed out of the Atlanta Dream Center Master's Commission, their ministry is dedicated to connecting non-profit Christian organizations with business corporations who are in need of temporary staffing solutions.

Several years ago, while raising funds for an overseas mission trip, Master's Commission helped staff a gathering for a multimillion dollar company that was throwing an event for several thousand attendees. The executive leadership was more than impressed with the integrity, strong work ethic, and bright attitudes that MC brought to their event. They asked if their were any more of us "out there." Our answer to them is the reason you are reading this right now.

Work often includes:

- -Event lengths are 1 day to several weeks.
- -Donation amounts equal to \$10/hr.
- -Average length of day is 10 hrs/day.
- -Workers must be able to stand for long periods of time.
- -Must be able to carry moderate amounts of weight on serving trays.
- -All workers are fed 1-2 meals while working shifts.
- -Staff must be friendly and hospitable to the event attendees.

MC has raised over \$4 million which goes for the students' missions, mission trips, and tuition.

Marco Micola — is the Executive Director of MC Foundation, Inc. His background began in business in the insurance industry 30 years ago as a Benefits Consultant with Acordia, Inc., the world's largest privately held brokerage firm.

In 2009, Marco became Executive Director of MC Foundation, Inc., focusing on establishing a national foot print, opening opportunities for fund raising all across the United States.

Marco is married with 4 children and 2 grand children and is heavily involved in urban ministry, as well as

ministries in Kenya, Africa and the middle east.

GOVERNOR PAT MCCRORY VISITS THE VILLAGE CHAPEL




