

Holy Land Tour: Israel November 2-11, 2021

This November, The Village Chapel and those from other churches - and the surrounding community- will have yet another opportunity to embark on a life-changing pilgrimage to The Holy Land. Even through the wake of the pandemic, the interest to visit Israel has not waned. Pilgrims who have visited Israel in years past are interested in going again.

Last year we took the largest contingency of non-Chapel folks than the previous trip. So interest is indeed community wide. Vickie and I still have significant relationships with couples who went from other churches. Lifelong friendships are not unusual to be formed on such a trip. There are several advantages to going with the Chapel's trip. First, it's the most inexpensive trip among the others offered, but in no way cheap. Register NOW for Apostles Build!

Now is the time to register for the Habitat for Humanity Apostles Build. If you are over 16, a man or a woman, we need you to register, and volunteer. Go to the website, <u>sandhillshabitat.volunteerhub.com</u>, sign the waiver and enter the date(s) you can volunteer. There are Saturdays available also.

As you may know, The Village Chapel has committed for three days in April: Thursday, April 15; Friday April 16; and Saturday, April 17. Saturday, March 6 is the community kick-off, Walls-Up Day- that is a fun day. And another church, Redeemer Presbyterian Church has asked for help on Thursday, March 11 and Friday, March 12.

The hours needed are from 8:00 am to 1:00 pm, each workday. The address is 220 E. Virginia Ave (left from RT 705), Robbins. No tools are required; there are opportunities for all skill levels, including unskilled (like myself.) Teens can operate the power equipment if they are over 18. The staff at Habitat will show and tell us what to do.

All the work is outside for COVID-19 safety. No food will be provided due to pandemic protocol; bring fruit and snacks if you wish. Water will be provided. (A restaurant, Mona Lisa 11, is nearby on RT. 705. that has sit -down as well as takeout service.)

The Apostles Build is totally sponsored by financial contributions and volunteer efforts of the faith community. We are building the home for Mrs. Ofelia Lopez and her 2 children. She works at First Health in the cardiac telemetry department. To be a Habitat homeowner, she takes 15 hours of classes in home maintenance, contributes 300 hours of sweat equity, and then takes on the thirty-year mortgage. This is a fun way to put our Christian faith in action by this good and exhilarating work.

Florence DeSandy, a former member of the Village Chapel, went to be with the Lord on January 13, 2021. Florence, who had been married to her husband Bob for 69 years before his passing in 2018, left Pinehurst after Bob's death and moved to Hixson, Tennessee to be near family.

Florence was a multi-talented woman, who had a successful career with Parke-Davis in Detroit prior to moving to Pinehurst. She was a member of the Daughter's of the American Revolution and loved golf. She attended the Village Chapel for many years and listed the Chapel as a donee in lieu of flowers. She will be laid to rest with her husband at Arlington National Cemetery and a memorial will be held at a later date.

We remember Bob and Florence with great affection and respect and are grateful that they gave their time and talents to the Village Chapel while living in Pinehurst.

Ellene Busby was called home to the Lord on January 29, 2021 while vacationing with her husband Jim in Florida. Ellene had been a member at the Village Chapel for twenty years where she contributed generously of her time and talents in many ways.

Ellene was born in Hot Springs, Arkansas, on June 28, 1942 into a large and close-knit family. She eventually found her way to Oklahoma City where she worked as an accountant while she worked on her CPA degree, which she passed on the first try. Meanwhile, Jim had also located in Oklahoma City working for Coopers Lybrand. The met, fell in love, got married on August 23, 1978 and started their own accounting business. In addition to the accounting business, they also invested in or owned an oil drilling company, a shopping mall and other enterprises.

Ellene loved to travel and she and Jim did a lot of it. They had their own plane and flew all over the United States looking for business opportunities and having a good deal of fun in the process. They also put thousands of miles on their RV. In 1989 they were in Greensboro, NC looking at business prospects when they learned of an opportunity in Southern Pines. They liked it, bought it, bought a home and hung out the Busby and Company shingle in February, 1989.

After several years at Brownston Presbyterian, the Busby's began looking at other churches and it was our good fortune that they decided the Village Chapel fit their spiritual needs. And the Chapel's financial needs were well matched to Ellene's financial skills. At one point, she served six consecutive years as Treasurer and, after a hiatus of three years, returned for another three years. She was deeply involved with financial planning for the original Christian Education center that was being planned in 2010 and was again in the middle of the planning for Heritage Hall. It is especially sad that she will not be here when construction begins in the

near future. We rest assured knowing that her spirit will be.

Her family described her as fiercely loyal to her friends and family. We know she was fiercely loyal to the Village Chapel. We are so grateful that after her full and interesting life, she settled down with us and applied her substantial skills and energy to fulfilling the mission of the Village Chapel. Thanks for that, Ellene, and God rest you.



A few months ago, we congratulated **Ellene Shannon** for joining our band of centenarians at the Village Chapel. On January 26, 2021, the Lord called her home. She died peacefully at Penick Village where she had resided for the past seven years. Her son John and her daughter, Carol were nearby.

Ellene was a fixture at the Village Chapel for many years, and before moving to Penick, she was very active in the community. She supported the Arts Council of Moore County, the classical concert series, the North Carolina Symphony, and the Moore County Choral Society, where John was the conductor for several years.

Ellene was born September 19, 1920, in Williamsport, PA, where she grew up and was an enthusiastic golfer, gardener, and dancer. She won golf tournaments, blue ribbons for floral design and loved both ball room dancing and square dancing with her husband Bill. She sang in the choir and taught Sunday School among other church activities.

Ellene and Bill had been visiting Pinehurst from Williamsport for thirty years before they moved here in 1984. They joined the Pinehurst Country Club where they continued playing golf and joined The Village Chapel, where their son John became the music director and, after thirty years, director of music emeritus. Ellen and Bill had been married for 55 years when he passed away on January 22, 1999.

Ellene was a loving mother, clearly proud of her children, and a warm and friendly congregant whom everyone loved in return. She always had a ready smile and a kind word for those who met her. She has been missed since she moved to Penick and became unable to attend services; but she was never forgotten. Nor will we forget her now that she has broken earth's bounds. We will continue to cherish her memory and all that she meant to the Village Chapel.
