An Enduring Vision for Christian Community: Worship, Learn, Serve

As an independent, interdenominational, Christian community, we look to the authority of scripture and the Lordship of Christ in all matters of doctrine and practice. Our mission is founded upon the precepts of worship, learning, and service.

First, The Village Chapel exists to worship God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Together, the Trinity are "worshipped and glorified," as we, and Christians throughout history, profess in the Nicene Creed. In the Gospel of John, our Lord teaches us, that the Father seeks worshippers (John

4:23). Therefore, we assemble together as a community of worshippers to give God our praise and thanksgiving, and to exalt His name in The Village of Pinehurst and Moore County. The Village Chapel is a place of worship, and we are His worshippers—not only on Sundays, but every day, and everywhere.

Next, we are called to become learners of Christ. Jesus said in the Gospel of Matthew, to learn from Him (Matthew 11:29), and He commissioned us to teach people about Him (Matthew 28:20). Christian living is Christian learning. As Dietrich Bonhoeffer once said, "Christianity without discipleship, is Christianity without Christ." Jesus desires for us to grow in our knowledge and understanding of Him, so we can be equipped to teach others, sharing the message of the Gospel—learners becoming imitators of Christ.

Finally, we are called to be servants—to serve God and to serve one another. Jesus said that He "did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Matthew 20:28) We are not to be "hearers" of the Word only, but "doers." (James 1:22) Following the Lord's example of sacrificial service, we too are to live sacrificially in our service to God, His Church, and others.

Upon these three pillars, is the vision of The Village Chapel founded.

How Are WE There for those who are Dealing with Dementia?

If you don't already know someone whose care partner is experiencing this disease, you should know this diagnosis is, unequivocally, long term. It is physically and emotionally wearing. Families are impacted, as much, if not more than the person who has the disease.

Senior Enrichment Center

The Moore County Department of Aging and Senior Enrichment Center whose mission is, "To provide services that promote the well-being of older adults" has more recently welcomed the role of being the "centralized hub" for all things Dementia in our local community, complementing and collaborating with Dementia Alliance, the Alzheimer's Association, and community advocate initiatives.

Keep posted on local educational opportunities, and reach out for support in printed materials, counseling, respite care (say "time away" to refuel). Funding for this service as well as others, is provided by the Federal Government and Moore County on a yearly basis. This January 2023 watch for a free educational seminar to be held at the SEC. To learn more about the services offered to seniors in Moore County or to simply sign up to receive the monthly newsletter to keep aware of all activities via email by calling (910-947-4483)

NC is way behind in providing demographic data per county. However, a simple math equation reveals that based upon 23,635 people living in Moore County that are 65+ there is an estimated 2,528 people living with Alzheimer's.

Dementia Alliance

Our community has leading medical interventions, but what are WE doing for those dealing with this disease?

Dementia Alliance, located in Raleigh, mission statement is "To improve the lives of all North Carolinans impacted by dementia, engaging and empowering them through support, education and research.

"They are a beacon for providing support group facilitator training classes, counseling, education and other useful programs to assist care partners with the disease process. Dementia Alliance is focused primarily on the care partner. (919-832-3732)

COVID impeded each of our lives on so many different levels Think about it - what kind of support did the care partners receive during this pandemic? Currently, 4 LIVE support groups are being held in various parts of our area; each group is being offered in various settings with different facilitators for one hour. Grief share and learn from others who are in the same situation, or have been. Dementia Alliance has Moore County groups listed on their website.

Community Presbyterian Church is actively developing what is known as a "Dementia Friendly Community" within the walls of it's church. What does that mean? An environment that is "informed, safe, and respectful of individuals with the disease, their families and caregivers. It provides supportive options that foster quality of life." One of the live support groups is held here on the first Wednesday of the month at 4 p.m. in the Parlor. This church has developed a library stocked with Dementia resources.

Dementia Dialogues

a 2 day 12-3:30 FREE workshop, will be presented-Sunday 2/26 and 3/5/2023 at Community Presbyterian Church.

Sandhills Community College Culinary Department accepted the offer to serve a FREE (anonymous donor) luncheon for couples living with Dementia on Thursday, March 2nd 2023 at the school dining room. This is a social gathering and time to meet others and those who are advocates of support. Pre-registration will be required and more information will be forthcoming. It is yet to be determined if there will be other opportunities within the community. Donations for future gatherings are welcomed. (Contact: Rae-Lynn-919-274-0123)

The Arts Council of Moore County also accepted a leadership position in our community to pilot efforts for studied art appreciation, socialization and time away in the lovely Campbell House galleries. The MOMA, NYC and the Louvre, Paris, FR were the first museums to implement programs to service this population and their care partners. **Early to early middle Dementia diagnosed individuals are welcomed with their care partners to sign up for this pilot during the 2023 calendar year. 6 couples are needed.

About Me Card

There is an international steering committee working to create an "About Me Care Card" that helps individuals living with Dementia (with or without their care partner) easily document what matters most to them. This document and message is then shared with their medical provider (clinician) during a clinic or hospital visit. The research team is looking for individuals and care partners to try this program with their clinicians or to simply provide feedback on the content of the card. Individuals with any level of dementia or mild cognitive impairment are welcome to participate.

Retreat Aberdeen

Prior to COVID, The *Retreat, Aberdeen*, was open to adults with cognitive and physical disabilities, to provide respite (say, "time away" to refresh) for the care partner. The Retreat had to be closed. Currently, we have no Adult Day Care facility in our county to provide this respite, program oriented day care opportunity.

Socialization for those dealing with a disability, desperately need, require, being connected with others. The care partner needs, requires, time to be alone, get personal business attended to, or to be with friends.


