

It's quite surreal to walk through Heritage Hall and imagine it filled with children and youth. I've actually seen the hall's activity room teaming with students when we opened the hall to

the community at Live After 5, on August 12. And to think that God blessed us with such an excellent space for discipleship, begs the question, what is next? What is the master plan for Heritage Hall going forward?

Matthew 28:18-20 is Christ's Great Commission to the Body of Christ to make disciples. This is the Master's plan for Heritage Hall. Making disciples obviously means teaching the students about Jesus, His life, His ministry, His mission.

Some of the ways we plan to disciple our students – in addition to being a supportive resource for our Chapel's families, as partners in the discipleshipmaking lifestyle – is through Children's Sermons, Sunday School, Youth Sundays, Vacation Bible School, and Confirmation classes.

We will also prayerfully seek creative ways to make disciples, remaining open to the endless possibilities that our new space will allow. The next priority is to share Heritage Hall with the community. We will constantly present Heritage Hall as the community's hall. Parents' Night Out is a good example of making the hall available to community parents, who don't yet know The Village Chapel is the new church home. To host it coincidentally during the Village's music event proved to be fortuitous.

Vacation Bible School, Fall Festival (Trunk-or -Treat), Easter Egg Hunt, have all been productive in



evangelizing new families; I'm honestly thinking of families in my mind who joined to the Chapel through an initial community outreach.

Still another priority is to host events – that are not necessarily Chapel sponsored – that will attract attention to our campus location and ministries. A good example of that is the National League of Junior Cotillion. Mrs. Sonja Lawrence is a huge TVC supporter and having her students use our facilities is a significant symbiotic relationship (sorry, Discovery Channel is on in the background).

Again, we will prayerfully consider creative ways to partner with organizations of the same ilk, to further the cause of the Gospel and expand the Kingdom in our village. From a summer tutoring ministry to three-on-three basketball tournaments (with opening prayers and a closing devotion, of course), the sky is the limit.

A word about the MarComm committee is warranted. From the efforts of our most talented, Steve McKenzie, to the eager and highly capable men and women who call themselves "MarComm," the existence of Heritage Hall is being elevated by the efforts of these folks, who continuously think of ways to promote the numerous possibilities for the hall,


Anne, with a love for children, taught Kindergarten and served as a mentor for new teachers.

From the Director of Music

hat a summer in the life of our Chapel! We celebrated the ministry of our out-going Senior Pastor John Jacobs, worshipped intimately in Chapel Hall for a month, and watched as the finishing touches were put on Heritage Hall. These events and other activities have been successful largely due to the efforts of many of our lay leaders and it is a blessing to serve with and for them. As we enter into a new season, I am excited to preview some of the musical opportunities in store for our Chapel.

Our Chapel Choir resumed rehearsals at the end of August after a period of rest and rejuvenation over the summer. Rehearsals began earlier than usual as the Chapel Choir prepares for the Heritage Hall Dedication Service on September 18, an historic occasion not to be forgotten in the life of this Chapel. has offered us new storage space, we were offered the opportunity to transition the former Sunday school/storage space into a music library. In addition to choral/orchestral/organ music, our library also includes a collection of hymnals from various traditions, especially for us as an interdenominational community. While much has been accomplished in making this shift, the delays in the Heritage Hall completion as well as some of our new filing boxes being on backorder, the new music library continues to be a work in progress.
